<b>Enactus Ireland</b>	Third level institutions nationwide	The 'Next Gen Accelerator' programme will support early-stage start-up social enterprises that have a demonstrated proof of concept, social impact and sustainability. Mentoring and training will be provided to start-up social enterprises that would not otherwise have access to such resources. They will receive tailored tools and resources applicable for their business area.	€41,800
<b>The Wheel</b>	Participants can attend training in Dublin, Cork or Galway.	The 'RevitaLESE' programme will provide a strategic 'reboot' for long-established social enterprises (LESEs). This project will primarily focus on LESEs in existence for seven to 20 years. This pilot will establish the stage of LESEs and develop initiatives for their reinvigoration and revitalisation. The training programme will be based on three separate deliveries (Dublin, Cork and Galway) of a four-module programme. Two 'Peer Community of Practice' sessions will also be provided.	€49,058
